Telehandler Training Courses Alberta - The employer has the responsibility to make certain that their workers are trained to work competently utilizing telehandler equipment. The staff need to be assessed for their ability to utilize the machine. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that workers obtain the needed level of ability. The level of responsibility of the person should be considered when training is provided. Effective training would remedy whichever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training could be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon completing the training period would determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator testing and training are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not deal with such topics as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, using various attachments, or the utilization of rotating equipment. Further training will have to be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler needs routine maintenance similar to any other machine. The equipment will wear out over time, so right maintenance is needed to ensure the safe use of the telehandler equipment. Inspections and checks are important to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators must have machine-specific training to be able to rectify, monitor and prevent problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Workers require experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance directions must be viewed seriously and complied with, considering such factors as environmental conditions in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machinery share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is usually done by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use checks are typically done by the user.
