Warehouse Forklift Training Programs Alberta - Warehouses can be retail, industrial or commercial facilities. Their function can differ from retailing bulk products to product distribution. Regardless of the kind of warehouse, staff inside warehouse settings must be well trained in safety measures related to material storage and handling, conveyor systems, loading docks, and forklifts and pallet jacks. Good housekeeping is important to a safe and orderly warehouse environment.

The loading dock system is often build into the warehouse at a height from the ground making it easy to move things moving out and coming in of the warehouse. Staff would also unload and load merchandise and materials from the ramps and elevated docks. Particular attention must be paid to safety habits throughout this stage. In order to avoid falls, install yellow striping along the edge of ramps and docks. Pay attention to the area all-around delivery trucks which are parked at the loading dock, especially the part between truck and dock. Be sure that truck wheels are chocked when unloading.

Some warehouses utilize conveyor systems to distribute products in the facility. Conveyor systems have moving belts and wheels which pose a pinch point hazard. Keep body parts and hair far away from conveyors to prevent injury. Elevated conveyors pose a hazard to staff below if safety nets are absent. Workers have to know how to stop conveyors in the event of emergency. Be aware of the location of emergency stop buttons and off switches. When servicing conveyors, lock out/tag out measures are mandatory.

In order to make it easier to move things, pallet jacks and forklifts are most normally utilized. The operator of the lift truck will need training and certification. Pallet jack operators do not need certification, but must be trained about the equipment. Training programs instruct operators in the proper methods for hoisting things and transporting them to their assigned location. Neither forklifts nor pallet jacks should ever be used to transport or lift staff.

Rack system and storage shelving help to create an orderly and efficient work area if they are braced, sturdy, and allow sufficient room for individuals and machinery to pass. Careful and slow placement of good is required to avoid accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles should be kept clear by storing products flat and within the shelving units. Pallets are utilized for stacking products. They should be in good condition, and palleted products should be shrink-wrapped or baled, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (PPE) should be worn, as appropriate, to protect employees' heads, limbs, hands and feet. Bump caps or hard hats, gloves and steel-toed shoes are common PPE.

Slippery floors which are pocked with pits and dents could present significant hazards, making good housekeeping really important. Warehouse floors and docks must be clear of debris oil and dirt. The area must be kept clear of boxes, baling supplies and trash.
